transcripts from your school. This will likely not include the last semester grades (You can send the final transcript after graduation). Make copies.

C) Secure three (3) letters of

recommendation from Teachers and/or Counselors and have them address the letters: To Whom It May Concern, (as you will be making copies). Send copies in with scholarship applications.

- D) **Take the SAT exam or ACT exam in the Fall of your Senior year:** Many of the scholarships applications require an SAT or ACT exam score. The applicant reviewers are not necessarily be concerned with your test scores, unless your score is in the top 10%. If you take the exam in the Spring of your Senior year, it will limit the scholarships that you can apply for. If you do not have money to pay for the exam, ask the local NLPOA Chapter to sponsor the cost of the exam. **Sign up for the exam that is given in October of your Senior year**, otherwise you may not make the scholarship deadlines.
- E) **Create a Resume** and include: Goals (always include that you hope to return to your community to help other students, senior citizens, handicap or an area that interests you); Schools attended; special classes taken; list any workshops attended including this one; list any volunteer work or special projects that you were involved in; and or music or athletic skills. (Proof read and spell check). Send resume in with scholarship application.

- E) Try to **Decide on a College Major** (talk to your counselor at the colleges), you can change after the first semester. While in high school, talk to your high school counselors.

- F) **Fill out a Financial Aid from FAFSA by February 1.** If your parents have not completed an Income Tax Return for the prior year, you are allowed to use your parents previous/latest Income Tax Return. Then, later, you can go back and update the information on FAFSA. Most (non-qualifying) monies are given out by March 1 of every year and so are scholarships. Don't hesitate and ask for help here.

- G) **Apply for Early admission and for Priority Scholarships by October 15** of your Senior Year. **Priority scholarships** by November 15 of your Senior Year.

- H) These are based on early admissions to the College or University. So apply for early admission at the start of your Senior Year. Otherwise you are competing with more students and for less money after February 1, of your Senior Year.
